1.4.2 – How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution? (maximum 500 words)

Feedback Obtained
<p>The teaching-learning process in the College is enhanced by regular feedback from the stakeholders. The feedback form comprises of seven different parameters namely effectiveness in teaching, clarity of voice, communication skills, use of examples and illustrations, readiness to extend extra help, punctuality of the teacher, level of discipline in the class, level of classroom discipline, and student teacher interaction. The feedback of approximately 50 of the students is collected in a randomized manner, viz. if the number of students in the class are more than 25 then 10 students are randomly selected and asked to fill the forms for each of the teacher teaching them their subjects. For a class where the number are students are less (e.g. M.Sc.) all the students are asked to fill the feedback forms. For analysis average is calculated considering score allotted for each parameter by the student. Based on the average, the final score for each teacher is calculated. The data thus generated is further processed by the Department of Mathematics. In an event of considerably low score in any of the seven criteria mentioned above or if any specific remark is given by the student, the teacher is made aware about the same by Head of the Department, and asked to take the</p>

corrective measures. This system helps in maintaining the quality of the teaching learning process. Students also fill student satisfaction forms. There are eight parameters in the form namely Teaching-Learning process, Conduct of Examination, Library facilities, Extra-curricular activities, Sports facilities, Security services, Grievance Redressal and Drinking Water and Washroom facilities. The infrastructural / Co-curricular facilities are improved by the college authorities as a regular practice. The feedback given by the students in the students' satisfaction form is taken into consideration during this process. The departments of Computer Science and Information Technology collect the online feedback through Google forms. Feedback is also obtained from the parents through the scheduled parent teachers meeting. Their suggestions and concerns are noted down and considered critically for the overall improvement of the college function for the benefits of the students. Every department has its own alumni group continuously interacting with their teachers through social media platform and giving positive feedback about the improvement of the department and College as a whole. Once in a year, alumni meeting is called by the college. The Alumni share their valuable inputs with the College authority and willingly help in the quality improvement of the College.

2.3.2 – Students mentoring system available in the institution? Give details. (maximum 500 words)

Many students in the College are first generation learners. Student Mentoring is the key to ensure good performance of the students. Mentors take care of overall wellbeing of students and provide them a support system to cope through their student life. Each class is divided into groups, which are allocated to each subject teacher of the class. The mentor- mentee ratio varies as per the number of students in the class. The mentor-mentee ratio in Arts, Science and Commerce faculties vary from 1:25 to 1:45 averaging out to 1:32. The mentor teachers identify the levels of learners and suitably guide them. Based on the individual learning level, students are given certain extra sessions for problem solving, practical revision, theory concept learning, application oriented case- studies, etc. The students are encouraged to use various e-resources and library resources to pique their interest further in the subject and ensure they score high and gain further insights into the subject of interest beyond the prescribed syllabus. The students needing more assistance are provided with additional problem-solving sessions, practical sessions and question banks to bring them at par with the rest of the class. The students are free to approach any of the mentors, in case of difficulty and seek guidance. Also the mentors are easily approachable on mobile and in person for the concerns regarding accessibility to content of syllabi and extra reading material through the Teams Classroom and SharePoint. The academic mentoring is supplemented with emotional and psychological support provided through the teachers, senior teachers, vice-principal and principal. The College has a counseling center where the students can approach or peers can recommend a case which is then taken up by the concerned faculty. The students are often seen to avail of this facility when in need of counseling or support. The College also has a Centre for Yoga and Philosophy which conducts workshops for Yoga, Meditation and Personality Development for the overall wellbeing of the students. The College gymkhana has appointed coaches and the talented students are groomed for physical and mental endurance for enhanced performance in sports. The year 2019-20 posed a huge challenge of Covid-19 pandemic. Faculty conducted surveys, personal counseling sessions to gauge the state of mind of students and the digital connectivity of the students, at their current residence. Once the basic digital connect of students was determined, the college provided Microsoft email IDs to students and organized Online Microsoft Teams Training sessions. Teachers developed personal connectivity with students and their parents to overcome the fear psychosis and bring them into the fold of Digital Learning. Webinars on Personality development, alternate career guidance digital Tools were organized to train the students on self- image enhancement. The College organized Public Lectures of Eminent Speakers of Pandemic Frontline Workers disburse information about preventing the spread of COVID. The College provided training for online examinations based on multiple choice questions using Schoolguru Quirio application.

A decent and well-maintained physical infrastructure with essential amenities is the basis for delivering a better education environment for all the stakeholders. The college authorities have been continuously taking several corrective measures to facilitate a better learning environment. Well-established policies and procedures adhering to the required standards are followed to augment its existing infrastructure and develop new ones for facilitating new programmes. Following are the few concrete steps and monitoring mechanisms that the college authorities have adopted for maintaining its various facilities within the college campus:

- Campus Security: ? Security personnels outsourced from a dedicated security agency are deployed 24x7 to safeguard the entire campus, ? The entire campus is networked with IP based CCTV setup for vigilance. ? An adequate number of different categories of fire extinguishers are installed at appropriate locations within the campus. Every year, fire fighting training through experts is being organized to train our support staff to handle unforeseen emergencies. ? Security personnel cabins and a Visitors cabin with a visitor management system are established at college entry gates to check visitors.
- Basic Amenities: ? Drinking water: A standard UV water filtration plant is implemented for facilitating the supply of safe drinking water at various locations within the college campus. An adequate number of water purifiers and water coolers are also installed. ? Washroom and Toilets: With the increasing students strength, two additional well-furnished fabricated toilet blocks have been installed at two separate locations within the college campus. Sanitary Vending Machines are also placed in ladies washrooms. ? Canteen: A separate canteen block is built within the college premises. This facility is outsourced to a professional caterer through a yearly contract for providing hygienic and delicious food at an economical rate. ? Ladies common room: A separate room for girls is being provided for their privacy and comfort.
- Repairs and Maintenance: ? The college authority has appointed an Army Major to administer the day to day issues related to infrastructure repairs and college maintenance ? Any repairs and maintenance tasks related to electrical, plumbing, carpentry, civil and others are addressed through outsourcing the work to professional handymen and contractors. A separate register for registering requisitions and complaints is maintained for appropriate, timely action. ? Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC)

for computers, Fire Extinguishers, Pest Control, Laboratory Apparatus, Printers, Photocopying Machines, Water Coolers, Fans, Air Conditioners and Water Purifiers are outsourced with private agencies. ? An adequate number of outsourced housekeeping staff has been deployed on a full-time basis to take care of the campus housekeeping jobs, gardening, and campus beautification. • ICT Amenities: ? The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled for providing internet facility to staff and students. ? The functioning and delivery of services are automated with the ICT setup for facilitating speedy services to students and staff. ? RFID and Biometric system is adopted to maintain discipline and keeping track of students and staff attendance. ? A dedicated, dynamic website and mobile app are designed and maintained through a private vendor

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5.3.2 – Activity of Student Council & representation of students on academic & administrative bodies/committees of the institution (maximum 500 words)

B. K. Birla College (Autonomous), Kalyan a multi-faculty premier institution of higher learning, with an enrolment of 7,000 students (for UG, PG and Research Programmes) is affiliated to the University of Mumbai. The College was established in 1972, by Kalyan Citizens' Education Society with the blessings of Late Shri B. K. Birla ji and Late Smt. Sarala ji Birla. Under Autonomy various bodies has been constituted like Governing Council, Board of Studies, Academic Council, Finance Committee, and Board of Examinations for the smooth functioning of both Academic and Administrative activities as per the University guidelines. The institution has a well-designed organogram with different bodies and committees. It aims to encourage leadership and manage different functions in tune with its vision and mission. 1. Participatory Management: The Institution has developed a system of efficient administration consisting of Director (Education), Principal and Vice Principals (Faculty wise and Unaided Courses). HoDs and Faculty Members also play an important role in implementing the vision and mission of the college. Department In-charge and Activity Coordinators have been appointed for each program offered by the self-financing unit. The College has constituted various committees and nominated Conveners to ensure a decentralized method of functioning. Some of the important committees of the college are Admission Committee, Discipline Committee, Gymkhana Committee, Arts Circle, Purchase Committee, Library Committee, Anti-Ragging Committee, Grievance Redressal Committee, Social Sciences Association, etc. Along with these, the Principal forms additional committees for specific functions/purposes such as Class-Wise Mentors, Discipline Maintenance Committee, Placement Cell, etc. The College has active Students' Council to give exposure and address their issues to the concerned authorities and assist in bridging the gap between the administration and the students. 2. Review Management: The College believes in monitoring, analysing, and developing strategies for overall growth of the institution. The Governing Council conduct meetings on regular basis for reviewing the functioning of the college. The Principal has an open-door policy. Issues, if any, are resolved

with due care. The College is ISO 9001-2015 Certified. The processes of administration are well defined. The College conducts Internal Audit twice a year as planned by ISO committee. Examination and Evaluation

Online platform is used for conducting Internal and semester end examinations with proctoring. For semester end examination and evaluation, each course of study is assessed through theory examination, class participation, project reports, presentations, etc. with prescribed weightage. RESO software is used for processing results. The College is having follows Credit Based Grading Semester System in UG and PG programmes Evaluation. The evaluation has been revised to 60:40 evaluation pattern involving 60 marks for theoretical semester end examination and 40 marks for internal assessment. Additional Exams are conducted for the students having Medical Emergency. Complete transparency is maintained in evaluation system.

Research and Development

Students are encouraged to prepare research-based projects. The students, research scholars and faculty are encouraged to participate, organize, and publish their research findings in peer reviewed (UGC listed journals, Web of Sciences and Scopus indexed journals). The faculty members are encouraged to attend FDPs, workshops, etc. organized by different organizations. Faculty members are involved in research and publish research articles at national and international forums. Project Proposals were submitted to different funding agencies. All the necessary help and guidance is provided to the faculty members by the college and management. Faculty members have filed Patents due to encouragement and support from college.

Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation

The College Library maintains books, magazines, journals, e-resources, and theses. The library also propels the utilization of e-resources like Inflightnet, NList, and Delnet. Library has Digital Library section for the students. There are separate reading rooms for boys, girls and staff members. Students' attendance is maintained through RFID card System. Suggestion Book is made available for improvisation in services. College campus is partially WIFI enabled. Classrooms are installed with smart

board and LCD Projectors. Faculty Members use ICT enabled teaching methods. The College has 24-hour Security Surveillance via CCTV Cameras.

Human Resource Management

All the rules and regulations related to Faculty Recruitment, Progression, Retirement, etc. are followed as per the guidelines of University of Mumbai and Government of Maharashtra. Qualified faculty members are recruited according to the requirements of academic programs. Faculty improvement programs are planned for enriching the Faculty Vitality and to maximize their performance in teaching-learning process and research. Performance appraisals are regularly filled, reviewed and necessary steps are taken for training and development. An open-door policy for feedback and prompt grievance redressal is being followed. Personal files of faculties are well maintained. Biometric attendance system ensures regularity and fair assessment.

Industry Interaction / Collaboration

College has signed various MOUs with different Universities (Globally) and Industries for Internships and Faculty Exchange Programs to facilitate Industry-Academia connect. The Placement cell conducts workshops like 'Corporate Pathshala' for training and development of the students. The college has an Entrepreneurship Cell which motivates and support the students for self-employment. Interaction with other Universities and Industry has helped in the improvement of Curriculum. Various companies like Capgemini, TCS, LT, etc. has carried out both online and offline campus recruitment. The distinctive feature of B. K. Birla College (Autonomous) includes array of initiatives for environment protection and spreading awareness about Climate Change. The College has taken several initiatives to encourage environmentally conscious practices every year. We involve students, teachers and members of

One such activity was organized during the year 2019-20 was cycle distribution to students staying in the perimeter of 2-3 kms from the College to expand eco-friendly footprints. These cycles were continued by the faculty members.
