



Report of the Event

Date: 22nd March 2024

Department of Economics & Business Economics has organized Ecofest with the name 'ECONSPIRE' on the theme 'India's Journey towards Third Largest Economy in the World' / 'भारताची जगातील तिसऱ्या मोठ्या अर्थव्यवस्थेकडे वाटचाल' on 20th and 21st March 2024 for economics students from class F.Y.B.A to M.A. wherein the footfalls were of 207 visitors.

The Ecofest consists of three different events on the said theme viz., Essay Writing Competition, Poster Making Competition and 3D Model Making Competition/ Exhibition.

On 20th March 2024, Essay Writing Competition and Poster Making Competition were organized on the topics; Development at the cost of Environment, International Openness to Trade and India as a Youngest Nation in the World: Opportunity or Challenge. In the Essay Writing Competition, 34 participants had registered from class F.Y.B.A to M.A. where Nandini Wankhede (S.Y.B.A) won 1st prize, Perna Sonawane (T.Y.B.A) won 2nd Prize and Akash Kekan (F.Y.B.A) got consolation prize. The judges for the event were Ms. Swati Jadhav and Ms. Devyani Chitte.

In Poster Making Competition, 19 participants were registered in which Sahil Shelar (F.Y.B.A) won 1st Prize and 2nd Prize was shared between Sameera Shaikh and Prachi Pagare, both from F.Y.B.A class. This event was judged by Dr. Bipinchandra Wadekar and Mrs. Sheetal Thakur.

On 21st March 2024, a 3D Model Making Competition was organized in Seminar Hall which was inaugurated by the gracious hands of Dr. Naresh Chandra, Director (Education) and Dr. Avinash Patil, Principal (BKBCK). The inauguration ceremony was bestowed with the kind presence of Dr. Harish Dubey, Principal (BKBNC), Vice-Principals Dr. Maninder Kaur Dhaliwal, Dr. Bipinchandra Wadekar, Mrs. Esmita Gupta and Dr. Mahadeo Yadav, faculty members from Arts, Science and Commerce streams, Parents of Third Year students and students. Overall, 12 teams had participated in the competition representing various dimensions of the country that will lead India towards becoming the Third Largest Economy of the World.

Details of the 3D Model Making Competition

3.	T.Y.B.A (A)	Southern Soar: Exploring Economic Growth & GDP Contribution of India's Southern States	It displayed industries in Telangana, Tirupati temple in Andhra Pradesh, automobile industry in Tamil Nadu, IT sector, gold mines in Karnataka, shipyard in Kerala and major food crops they produce.
4.	T.Y.B.A (A)	Culturally rich, economically strong & fastest growing: West and Central India	It represented Maharashtra as the leading contributor of 134.3 billion U.S. dollars to the total retail GDP, Gujarat maintaining its position of being one of the fastest growing and Tourism sector of Goa.
5.	T.Y.B.A (A)	Northern Odyssey: Illuminating India's Journey to the Third Largest Economy	It elucidated Delhi's remarkable GSDP growth and emphasis on sustainable development, Uttar Pradesh's diverse economic landscape, Uttarakhand's renewable energy initiatives, Jammu & Kashmir's expanding banking network.
6.	T.Y.B.A (A)	Eastern Financial Innovative India	It showcased country's oldest and one of the largest steel plants, operated by the world's 10th largest steel manufacturer - Tata steel, focus on Maize cultivation by the government.
7.	T.Y.B.A (B)	Primary Sector	It presented the changing nature of agriculture. Now agriculture is not limited to livelihood, but farming is done from a commercial point of view and there is an attempt to mention the work of NABARD Bank in providing cottage industry financing.
8.	T.Y.B.A (B)	Secondary Sector	An attempt was made to cover the entire secondary sector including Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises. Proper involvement of banks and institutions was highlighted. Contribution in GDP, export and employment, manufacturing process of textile, spices and steel industries were also shown using moving model.
9.	T.Y.B.A (B)	Service sector	It showcased the Tertiary Sector Model including services like education, health, transport/communication, banking, tourism, entertainment, IT sector etc. Schemes and various programs conducted by the government for promoting these services were included. Also, the actual service process was shown.

10.	S.Y.B.A (A)	MSME: Engines of Prosperity in the New Era	It depicted MSME through JK Paper Ltd. manufacturing line which focuses on sustainable development. It also highlighted the contribution of Service Enterprises and Financial Institutions in MSME.
11.	F.Y.B.A (Major)	ISRO	It highlighted the contribution of ISRO in economic development through showcasing Aryabhata - first artificial satellite, Chandrayaan LVM3-M4 Rocket, Mangalyaan PSLV-C25 & ISRO's transformational journey and hard work from bicycles to the moon.
12.	F.Y.B.A (Minor)	Sagarmala Project	It focused on the Sagarmala project which aims to enhance the coastal infrastructure, port connectivity and maritime trade. It showcased how many ports will be established along Indian coastline in different states. Sagarmala means garland of sea.

Each Class/ Team was allotted with a Mentor Teacher who guided them for the 3D Model Making Presentations. The judges for the 3D Model Making Competition were Dr. Bipinchandra Wadekar and Mrs. Sheetal Thakur.

The 1st Prize for 3D Model Making Competition was shared between teams Unraveling the soul stirring states of Northeast (T.Y.B.A) and Primary Sector (T.Y.B.A). Over again, the 2nd Prize was shared between two teams viz., Secondary Sector (T.Y.B.A) and ISRO (F.Y.B.A).

Winners were felicitated with Medals and Certificates whereas all the participants were provided with a participation certificate.

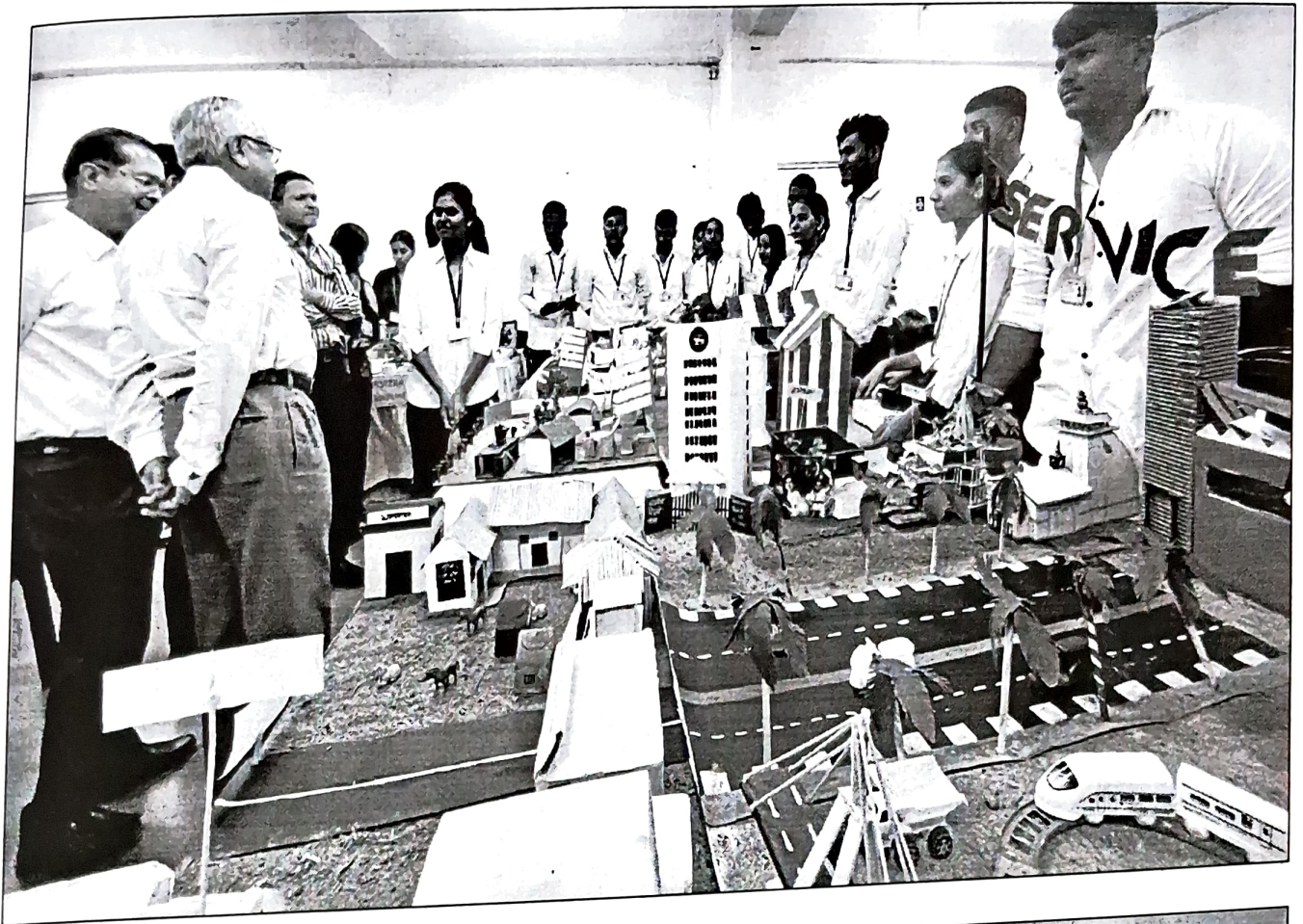

A Grey Swan refers to an event that is anticipated to some extent but is still characterized by uncertainty regarding its timing, magnitude, or specific nature.




3) WHITE SWAN EVENT

A White Swan is a highly predictable event that is easily anticipated, and its size or importance can easily be estimated over time.




THE GREAT DEPRESSION 1929-1939


SWIFT INFLATION RESPONSE BY RBI

During Inflationary Periods, the RBI normally implements conventional monetary policy measures such as Raising the Repo Rate, which are considered standard responses in line with expectations, making them a White Swan Event.



THE DOT-COM BUBBLE

The Dot-com Bubble of the 2000s was a period of excessive speculation and investment in internet-based startups, leading to a rapid rise and subsequent crash in their stock prices.




GEOPOLITICAL TENSIONS

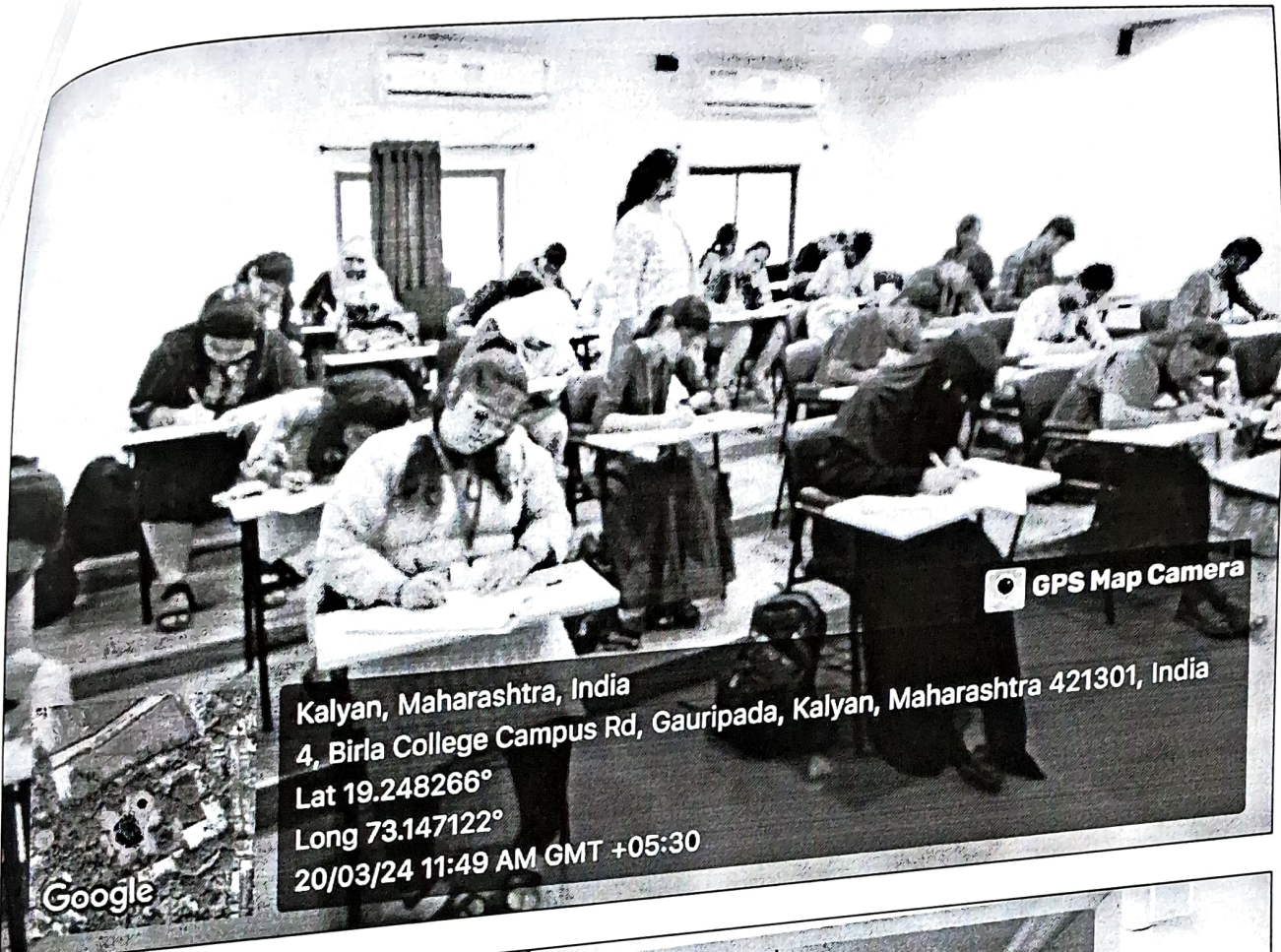


COVID-19 RECESSION





'Report on the Industrial Visit to Sahyadri Farms and Coin Museum, Nashik'

Introduction:

The visit to Sahyadri Farms and Coin Museum in Nashik was organized by the Department of Economics & Business Economics to provide students with an insight into the agricultural practices, supply chain management, and cooperative model employed by one of the leading fruit and vegetable producers in India. The visit aimed to enhance understanding of agricultural economics, sustainability practices, and the role of cooperatives in modern agriculture, followed by a tour of the Coin Museum (Shanti-Krishna Museum of Money and History). Overall, 98 students were part of the visit on 9th March 2024 accompanied by 4 faculty members.

Objective:

The primary objectives of the visit were:

- To understand the agricultural practices, technologies, and processes adopted by Sahyadri Farms for fruit and vegetable production.
- To explore the cooperative model and its significance in promoting farmers' welfare, market access, and value addition.
- To observe the supply chain management practices, including harvesting, grading, packaging, and distribution of agricultural produce.
- To exhibit the collection of the different versions of Indian currency.

Details of the Visit:

The visit to Sahyadri Farms encompassed the following activities:

- **Departure:** The journey began from the college campus at 7 AM. The students were accommodated by 2 buses from Kalyan to Nashik. The departure time was 7:00 AM & the arrival to the Sahyadri Farms was at 11:00 AM.
- **Welcome and Introduction at Sahyadri Farms:** Upon arrival, students were greeted by representatives of Sahayadri Farms who provided an overview of the company's history, objectives, and achievements.
- **Farm Tour:** A guided tour of the farm was started, where students observed various cultivation practices, including greenhouse farming, drip irrigation, pest management, and the use of organic fertilizers.



- **Processing Units:** Further the students visited the processing units where fruits and vegetables are sorted, graded, and packaged according to quality standards, adhering to food safety regulations.
- **Supply Chain Management:** The visit included a walkthrough of the logistical operations, including cold storage facilities, transportation fleet, and distribution networks used to deliver produce to domestic and international markets.
- **Cooperative Model:** Representatives explained the cooperative structure of Sahayadri Farms, highlighting its role in empowering farmers, providing access to markets, and ensuring fair returns for agricultural produce.
- **Lunch:** Visit was accompanied by a delicious lunch at Sahyadri Farms followed by some shopping for Farm Fresh products.
- **Visit to Museum:** Students were taken to the Coin Museum (Shanti-Krishna Museum of Money and History) set up by the Indian Numismatic, Historical and Cultural Research Foundation. In the museum, 2500 years of Indian history have been encapsulated in numerous panels. Information on the earliest coins dating back to the 6th/5th century BCE to the present currency and everything in between were available to the visitors. The displays are supplemented by minting dioramas and paintings. It has beautiful natural history galleries that take on a captivating journey of the evolution of various life forms on Earth through naturally preserved remains. Fossils of animals, plants, and mammals provide insight into their various developmental stages and past climatic conditions.
- **Journey back home:** During the journey back home students visited Shri Trimbakeshwar Jotirling & explored the various stalls & the surrounding areas. Students were provided with HighTea & Snacks at 5:30 PM. All students reached safely at home & the journey ended at 10:00 PM at the campus of B. K. Birla College, Kalyan.

Key Learnings:

- **Sustainable Agriculture:** Witnessing sustainable farming practices emphasized the importance of environmentally friendly approaches in modern agriculture.
- **Cooperative Principles:** Understanding the cooperative model illustrated the significance of collective action in addressing the challenges faced by smallholder farmers and enhancing their bargaining power.
- **Quality Assurance:** Observing quality control measures underscored the importance of maintaining high standards to meet market demands and consumer preferences.
- **Market Access:** Learning about the distribution networks highlighted the role of efficient supply chain management in ensuring timely delivery of fresh produce to domestic and international markets.
- **Community Development:** The visit showcased the positive impact of Sahayadri Farms on the socio-economic development of rural communities through employment generation and infrastructure development.


Conclusion:





The first thing that we did after entering the premises was refuel ourselves by heading towards the Food court that highlighted the diverse offerings from across India, the students and our teacher enjoyed different delicacies, ethnic cuisines, and various authentic servings from several cultures in India. After that students were provided with a customer feedback link for survey purposes so that they could learn about customer satisfaction and behavior, also the students were taking suggestions for next year.

Students and faculty of B.K. Birla College, Kalyan visits the Mahalaxmi Saras exhibition every year for the educational field trip and takes different surveys last time the survey was conducted on the sellers and artisans and learning about what gimmicks they use, difficulties faced by them, and the financial support they get, etc. The Saras fair was held in the CIDCO exhibition center, Vashi, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra.

There were over 511 stalls which not only showcase our cultural treasures but also serve as a platform for rural women entrepreneurs through Self Help Groups (SHGs), featuring food products and a food court that highlights the diverse offerings from across India. This year's event boasts over 500 stalls featuring a diverse array of products from across India. Notably, NABARD has contributed to the mela's unique offerings, supporting 49 stalls of artisans from across the country.

Conclusion:

Anyone who wants to experience the traditional and artsy wave of the exhibition can visit 10 am to 10 pm. Every single evening Saras conducts a cultural programme on stage that everyone can attend. To conclude, the field visit was a success and students learned a lot of things while having fun, a sweet balance. We left the premises at 2:15 pm with a ton of knowledge.

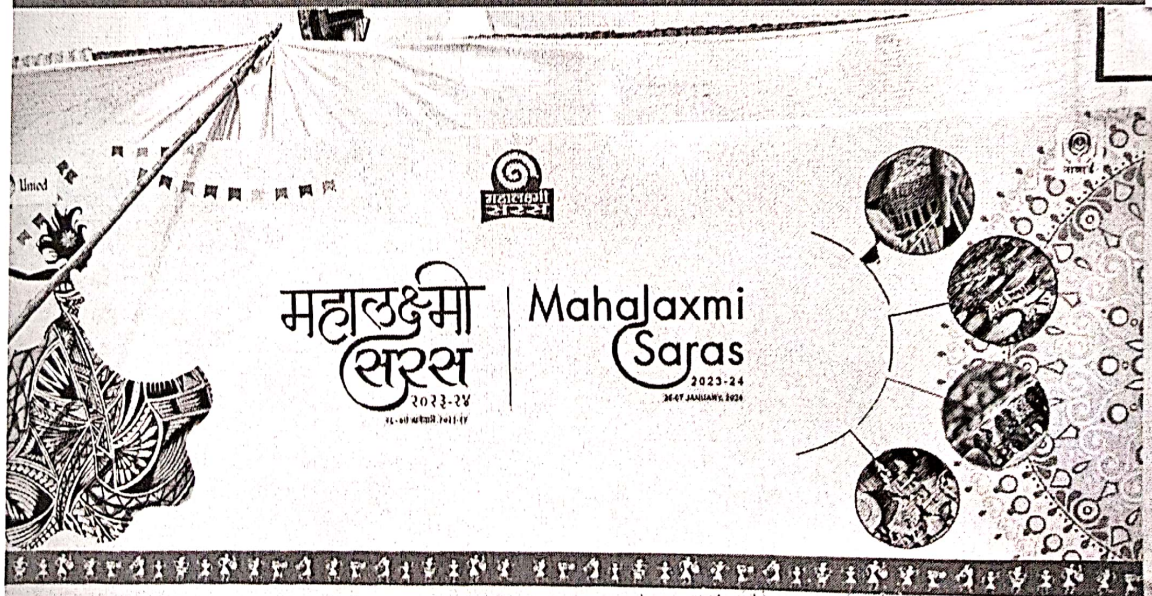
