'Cyber Savvy: Empowering Digital Citizens' Held on 27th April 2024

Departments of Accountancy and Commerce organized a Symposium on Cyber Savvy: Empowering Digital Citizens in the honor of Dr. Bipinchandra Wadekar, Vice Principal Commerce, on 27th April, 2024 at Seminar hall from 10:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

The program started with the traditional lighting of the lamp, followed by a brief invocation to set a positive tone for the day. Dr. B. S. Wadekar, Vice Principal (Commerce) of BKBCK, gave an overview of the day's program, highlighting its significance.

He mentioned different types of attacks like phishing, malware, and hacking that can happen to anyone, big or small. He also talked about real-life examples like a big bank lending money and how cybercrime is shown in movies and shows like "Jamtara." Dr. Bharadwaj explained about online banking and the laws that protect our data. He said it's important for companies to have someone responsible for keeping our data safe. Overall, he showed how important it is for everyone to be careful and for companies to have strong security measures to protect against cybercrimes.

Dr. Vrinda Nishandar took the stage to invite Dr. Rukmani Krishnamurthy for the Keynote Address. During her speech, Dr. Rukmani Krishnamurthy, the CEO of Helik Advisory Limited in Mumbai, used a PowerPoint presentation to share her experience as a forensic expert, discussing significant cases she has solved.

Dr. Krishnamurthy highlighted various technologies used by forensic experts to investigate crimes. She emphasized the importance of forensic science in solving complex cases and ensuring justice. Her talk provided insights into the fascinating world of forensic investigation and showcased the crucial role played by technology in this field. Her expertise and dedication to her work are undoubtedly commendable, and her stories would have inspired many to appreciate the crucial role of forensic experts in upholding justice and solving crimes.

The morning concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks delivered by Mr. Bharat Bagul, Assistant Professor in the Department of Accountancy. After which attendees were directed for lunch break.

The afternoon session commenced with Mr. Akash Kamble, Assistant Professor, Dept. of I.T., introducing the resource person, Dr. Harish Chandar, Founder-Director of India Tech, Andheri, who led an enlightening session on cyber security and financial risk.

During his talk, Dr. Harish Chandar discussed different ways hackers can attack us online and shared his expertise. He mentioned how quickly our personal information can be stolen, like our Gmail in 10 seconds, WhatsApp in 25 seconds, Facebook in 15 seconds, and Instagram in 10 seconds, showing how vulnerable our social lives are to cyber threats. He talked about scams, like when hackers change QR codes to trick people into going to harmful websites. Dr. Chandar also warned about financial risks, such as credit card fraud and malware infections, which can happen when we are not careful with online links. He suggested using tools to check if a QR code is safe before scanning it. Overall, he reminded us to be cautious online and shared tips to protect ourselves from cyber threats.

Afternoon first session was concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks delivered by Ms. Sanjana Shrivastav. After which Mrs. Jyoti Tupe, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Accountancy BKBCK, then introduced the next resource persons, CA Rahul Satale and CA Vishal Khade from VANS and Associates, who presented insightful case studies on cybercrimes.

They also discussed the role of forensic accounting in supporting legal proceedings. Looking ahead, they suggested that forensic accounting will remain crucial in detecting and preventing financial crimes in the future.
